To verify that you provided correct information, we will compare your FAFSA with the information on this institutional verification worksheet and with any other required documents. If there are differences, your FAFSA information may need to be corrected. You and at least one parent must complete and sign this worksheet, attach any required documents, and submit the form and other required documents to us. We may ask for additional information. If you have questions about verification, contact STUDENT FINANCIAL SERVICES as soon as possible so that your financial aid will not be delayed.

A.- TAX RETURN FILERS
