Our department is dedicated to providing students with the best that music education has to offer. With leading faculty members, regular masterclass and performance opportunities, elite international touring ensembles, and a comprehensive scholarship program, the Department of Music is committed to giving students the tools and experience needed to become successful professionals. Southwestern Adventist University is a place in which students are challenged, inspired and supported through their academy journey. The music faculty are fully invested in each student, working diligently to assist in their longterm development in pursuit of graduate studies and employment opportunities.

In the past year the Department of Music has had the privilege to represent Southwestern Adventist University through performance invitations in the US and abroad, including to Merida, Mexico and as guest choir in Westminster Abbey in London, England.









Elaine Hagenberg

Elaine Hagenberg's music "soars with eloquence and ingenuity" (ACDA Choral Journal). Her award-winning compositions are performed worldwide and frequently featured at American Choral Directors Association conferences, All-State festivals, Carnegie Hall, and other distinguished international concert halls from Australia to South America and throughout Europe.

In addition to composing full-time, Elaine actively engages in bringing her music to life as the guest artist and featured clinician for professional conferences and festivals both in the U.S. and abroad as a composer, conductor, and accompanist of her work.

With over fifty commissioned works, she has composed new music for the American Choral Directors Association, professional choirs, colleges and universities, community choirs, high schools, and churches. "I Am the Wind" was named the winner of the 2020 ACDA Brock Competition for Professional Composers.

Elaine has music in print with various publishers including Oxford University Press, G. Schirmer, Hinshaw Music, and Beckenhorst Press. Currently, she publishes her concert music independently through Elaine Hagenberg Music which is distributed through GIA.

Illuminare is Elaine's first extended work, consisting of five movements for SATB chorus and chamber orchestra. Using lesser-known sacred Latin, Greek, and English texts, the piece takes us through a season of beauty and goodness that has been disrupted by darkness and confusion. But as Light gradually returns, hope is restored, illuminating our future and guiding us in peace.

FEATURED ARTISTS



Marcos Machado is a highly acclaimed Brazilian-American double bassist celebrated for his virtuosic performances and inspiring stage presence. *The Strad* has praised his "incredibly fluid" left-hand technique, while *Fanfare* has commended his "musicianship and technical prowess."

Dr. Machado serves as Professor of Music at The University of Southern Mississippi (USM). At USM, he

has organized twelve editions of the "Southern Miss Bass Symposium." He is also the founder of the Pampa International Music Festival (FIMP) in Brazil and the founder of *Bass by the Sea*, a national double bass competition in memory of UIUC Professor and his mentor, Michael Cameron.

Machado's impressive career includes active performing and teaching schedules, tours throughout the USA, Europe, and South America, and three Grammy* nominations. Machado is the only South American to have earned both the "Teaching" and "Performance" diplomas from the prestigious L'Institut International de Contrebasse de Paris, where he studied with the world-renowned double bassist François Rabbath.

Machado's versatility has inspired many composers to write works for the double bass dedicated to him. He has given world premiere performances of several works, including American composer P. Kellach Waddle's "The Dark and The Silent" for solo bass, Brazilian composer B. Cunha's "Momento Nordestino n°2," Arthur Barbosa's "Concerto for Double Bass and Orchestra," and the world premiere of American composer Frank Proto's Partita for Solo Double Bass. Machado gave the South American premiere of Wolf Totem by Tan Dun and two of Frank Proto's Concertos: A Carmen Fantasy and Nine Variants on Paganini for double bass and orchestra.

Machado has written "Tao of Bass," a multi-volume technique book incorporating three decades of research on double bass technique. Several universities adopted the first volume as a required text, and the second volume will be released in 2023.

Machado's discography includes many collaborations with ensembles and musicians. The Duo Machado-Fialkow (with Brazilian pianist Dr. Ney Fialkow) has published two CDs with the Blue Griffin label, "Metamorfora" and "Fantasy," both critically acclaimed by publications such as *The Strad* and *Fanfare*. Machado performs on a David Tecchler double bass, c. 1700, and a modern custom-built double bass by Italian-Brazilian luthier Andrea Spada (1975-2022). Machado's signature bow, "Tao," was crafted by the world-renowned luthier Alessandro Alberi.



Saxophonist Dr. William Chien is a performer and educator. He has performed throughout the United States, Europe and Asia, and has performed with Dallas Asian Wind Ensemble, New England Saxophone Ensemble and University of North Texas Symphonic Band. Dr. Chien holds the degree of Doctor of Music from the University of North Texas and Master of Music from the Boston Conservatory. He is the author of Saxophone

Learning for Novices and Saxophone Altissimo. He is an endorsing artist for both Yanagisawa Saxophone and Legere Reed. Since 2018, Dr. Chien has taught saxophone at Southwestern Adventist University. He lives a fulfilling life with his wife, pianist Kate Kang, as dedicated parents of their two daughters, MuAnna and Mika.

Composer Amy Quate works in a wide variety of musical styles, forms, and media. Her career encompasses commissioned compositions, musical performing, computer music, computer graphics, audio and video technical work, and multi-media production. She has published both literary and musical compositions. Angel1 was commissioned for the Department of Music at Southwestern Adventist University and will also be performed by Dr. Chien and Dr. Howard at the 2023 North American Saxophone Alliance Conference in April.
