Honors Program

Is the Honors Program just more work? Not at Southwestern. Our Honors Program offers a stimulatingly different approach to learning. It is not the academic equivalent of boot camp with extra push-ups!

It is designed for well-prepared students who seek a new challenge, relish discussion, and want to engage important ideas. Our courses often transcend disciplinary lines: a mathematician and an historian, for example, might lead out in the examination of a classic religious test. Honors students also have the opportunity for summer study abroad. A recent trip studied the Roman Empire and early Christianity in Italy, visiting sites ranging from Rome to Pompeii. Each honors graduate designs a special research project, completed in the senior year.
