They will conduct academic coaching through individual or group sessions to help students assess their performance and develop academic success plans. The Graduate Success Coach will also assist students in developing self-efficacy by identifying and overcoming obstacles that may impede academic success.

Requirements	Bachelor's degree, experience in leadership/management, agreeable disposition, and ability to work well with people. Experience with academic success coaching preferred.
